Representative Hambley's Highlights of the 132nd General Assembly

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69th District Representative Steve Hambley

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Throughout 2017-2018, members of the 132nd General Assembly have moved quickly to address many of the needs and concerns of our constituents. As the end of the legislative year approaches, bills protecting consumers, extending alternative high school graduation requirements, and allowing MetroHealth to extend services into Medina County found their way to the Governor's desk and were signed into law. A number of the bills, which I am a primary sponsor, originated from constituents of the 69th district bringing their concerns to me and were successfully enacted. I have included a legislative score card in addition to some notable bill summaries for your information.

Thanks to the 69th District voters, I won my re-election campaign in November and will be returning in January to start another General Assembly session along with the inauguration of Governor DeWine. My heartfelt thanks to the voters for giving me the opportunity to continue serving our county and state.

HB 491 (Rep. Edwards) Co-Sponsor. Requires the State Board of Education to issue substitute licenses to speech-language pathologists, audiologists, registered nurses who hold bachelor's degrees in nursing, physical therapists or physical therapist assistants, occupational therapists or occupational therapist assistants, and social workers who satisfy certain conditions. Other provisions added by Senate and concurred by House:

- Protects from liability for loss of public funds a school district or educational service center treasurer whose official duties have been performed without negligence or wrongfulness. (HB 705)
- Extends the alternative graduation pathways for two additional years to the classes of 2019 and 2020. Requires the Department of Education to make recommendations for new permanent graduation requirements and to present them to the House and Senate Education committees by April 1, 2019.

SB 223 (Sen. La Rose) Prohibits the installation of unsafe used tires on specified motor vehicles. Makes a violation of the prohibition a violation of the Ohio Consumer Sales Practices Act. Excludes from the prohibition tires mounted on wheels or rims that are temporarily removed from a vehicle and reinstalled on the same vehicle. Imposes a fine of no more than \$1,000 for a violation of the prohibition.

SB 20 (Sen. Hackett) Co-sponsor. Destiny's Law. Adds prison term if permanently disable victim. Requires an additional prison term of six years for an offender who is convicted of felonious assault and a specification charging that the victim suffered permanent disabling harm and was less than ten years old at the time of the offense, regardless of whether the offender knew the victim's age.

HB 329 (Rep. Pelanda) Co-sponsor. Modifies the law governing pyramid promotional schemes. Establishes that a violation against a pyramid promotional scheme is considered an unfair or deceptive act or practice in connection with a consumer transaction, which is a violation of the Consumer Sales Practices Act (CSPA). Permits the Attorney General to use all the powers and remedies existing under the CSPA to enforce violation of the prohibition against pyramid promotional schemes.

HB 111 (Rep. Carfagna) Co-sponsor. Authorize nurses to compel mental health evaluations as well as various changes to medical services practitioners licensing. Amendment added in legislative process authorizing MetroHealth Medical Center system to extend services into adjoining counties, such as Medina County.
